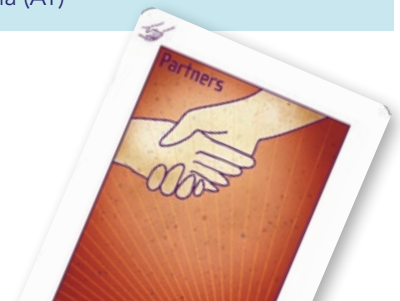

- Airport Line 12: a bus leaves every 20 min (ticket: 4 €). To get the to Rendezvous, you need to get out at "Luxembourg" (station), take the bus 38, "Héros" direction, "Vleurgat" stop, and 10 minutes walk.
